





Facts about Iraq

Population	37,547,686
Religions	 Islam (95%) Shiites (65%) – Spelled Shia'a sunnis (35%) –Spelled Sunna Christians and Others (5%)
languages	 Official: Arabic Kurdish Others (Turkmen, Persian etc.)
Ethnicities	 Arab (75%) Kurdish (17%) Others (8%) Assyrians, Turkmen, Mandeans, Armenians Circassian, Iranians, Shabakis, Yazidis, African descent.
Government	Federal parliamentary republic

Iraq: Birthplace of Civilization, Biblical Arena

Ancient Mesopotamia

- The "Fertile Crescent" The land between the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers, the hypothetical location of the "Garden of Eden."
- One of the centers of earliest known human civilization.
- Home of the Babylonian, Assyrian and Persian Empires.
- Figures prominently in the events and history chronicled in the Old Testament.







Modern Iraq

- 1918: Iraq, a part of the Ottoman Empire, is seized by the British in World War I.
- 1932: Iraq is made an independent kingdom.
- 1958: Iraq becomes a "republic," ruled over by military strongmen and torn by competing factions.
- 1968: The Ba'ath Party overthrows government; General Ahmad Hasan Al-Bakr, relative of Saddam (Hussein), becomes president

Modern Iraq - The First Problem

- 1979: Al-Bakr "resigned;" Saddam becomes President.
- 1980 1988: Saddam launched a war against Iran to reclaim disputed border regions.
- The war dragged on for eight years; the two nations lose over 1,000,000 men between them.








Modern Iraq - Second Problem

- 1990: Saddam invaded Kuwait (Moneydebt, Oil and Political Issues).
- 1991: A coalition of nations led by the United States and operating under the authority of the United Nations defeated Iraq and freed Kuwait. (Desert Storm).
- 1991: UN Security Council decided that Iraq must disarm itself of all weapons of mass destruction "WMD".
- UN also applied heavy economicsanctions "Embargo" lasted until 2003.





Almost 100,000 surrendering Iraqi soldiers became Prisoners of War (POWs).

Iraq and Weapons Of Mass Destruction

- Iraq has failed to comply with UN resolutions and has continued to seek and develop WMD.
- 2002 Congress passes Authorization for use of military force (AUMF)
- UN ordered weapons inspectors out as American (invasion – liberation) appeared immanent
- President Bush ordered Saddam and sons out.





The dream has came TRUE

- April 9th, 2003, the US army announced the full collapse of Saddam's government.
- The page of dictatorship has been turned over.
- Saddam has disappeared as well as his family and followers.
- Most of the Iraqi people celebrated that day and remembered their loved ones who have been arrested, persecuted, and killed by Saddam.








CAP- a month after April 9th, 2003

- Survived for many times.








ISIS
